Mr. Sterling presented the item to the Board. He discussed the revisions to the Employee Handbook and Classification and Compensation Plan. He further stated that a lot of work had been done to develop a compensation & classification plan, and an MOU, that is financially responsible. He further stated the Plan affords the District the opportunity to offer a benefits and salary schedule that will allow the District to recruit and retain employees. The Board was presented with an alternative proposed Salary Schedule that reflected a different salary range for the Office Manager and Finance Clerk positions. The Board considered the item. The Board did not take action on the proposed alternative salary schedule.

Mr. Sterling stated in the C&C Plan the salary schedule is to be reviewed by the General Manager every three years, in hopes to keep the District competitive with industry pay.

Summary:

The District's Service Truck #11 a 2004 Chevy 1500 has a failed transmission and Rear Differential. The cost to repair the vehicle (approximately \$5,500) is in excess of the vehicle's value (approximately \$3,000). Originally scheduled, the Equipment Committee had anticipated beginning to replace the District's fleet in fiscal year 17/18, with the failure of Service Truck 11, the replacement needs to be done during the current 16/17 fiscal year. The District's staff mechanic received three quotes for a 2017 Chevy Silverado 1500 4 wheel drive pickup truck as follows:

- 1) American Chevrolet- \$25,976.05
- 2) Sierra Motors- \$35,174.00
- 3) Steve's Chevrolet- \$24,999.34

The purchase would be allocated to the Sewer and Water Enterprise funds (50% to each) as \$12,499.67 from Operations and Maintenance line items respectively.



Consider for Approval Groveland Community Services District Encroachment Permit for City and County of San Francisco to Install Water Monitoring Devices at

the Big Creek Shaft and Second Garrote Shaft Facilities

Summary:

The City and County of San Francisco are preparing to install equipment to monitor conditions within the Mountain Tunnel. This real time information will assist in operations of the Mountain Tunnel and Water Quality operations, with the Data being gathered shared with the District. The monitoring equipment will be installed at the Big Creek and Second Garrote Turbine pump sites and a supply pump will be installed within the mountain tunnel to provide sample water for the instruments. The proposed equipment will be supplied power via the District's existing electrical service with the City and County reimbursing the District for costs associated with the equipment, estimated to be \$1836.00 for the Big Creek site and \$2,268.00 for the Second Garrote site annually. The cost for electricity will be adjusted annually to reflect current charges being paid by the District.

Recommended Action

Approve the Groveland Community Services District Encroachment Permit for the City and County of San Francisco to install Water Monitoring Devices at the Big Creek Shaft and Second Garrote Shaft Facilities.

GROVELAND COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT ENCROACHMENT PERMIT FOR CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO TO INSTALL WATER MONITORING DEVICES AT THE BIG CREEK SHAFT AND SECOND GARROTE SHAFT FACILITIES

This Encroachment Permit ("Permit") is issued by GROVELAND COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT, a political subdivision of the State of California and a community services district formed and operating pursuant to the provisions of Government Code Section 61000 et seq., hereinafter referred to as "DISTRICT", and the City and County of San Francisco, hereinafter referred to as "PERMITTEE," as of ______, 2016

RECITALS

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is a community services district, formed and operating under the Community Services District Law (Government Code §§ 61000 et seq.); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with California Government Code section 61060(d), DISTRICT may own and manage real property for the benefit of the district; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with California Government Code section 61060(h), DISTRICT may enter into and perform all contracts; and

WHEREAS, PERMITTEE desires to encroach upon a portion of the facility at Big Creek Shaft and a portion of the facility at Second Garrote Shaft, both owned and managed by DISTRICT, for the purpose of installing Adit Monitoring Stations to monitor the water conditions within the Mountain Tunnel ("Project"); and

WHEREAS, said Project shall comport with the specifications and requirements set forth in Section 6 of this Permit; and

WHEREAS, DISTRICT desires to grant this Permit upon the terms and conditions herein specified and by acceptance of this Permit, PERMITTEE agrees to observe and perform.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, PERMITTEE and DISTRICT agree as follows:

1. Permit Description.

- A. DISTRICT does hereby grant to PERMITTEE permission to that portion of the facility at Big Creek Shaft and that portion of the facility at Second Garrote Shaft, both owned and managed by DISTRICT, identified in the July, 2015 Submittal Drawings attached and incorporated herein as Exhibit A.
- B. This Permit shall not be valid until a fully executed copy of this Permit, signed by all named parties, is returned to DISTRICT, in care of Daniel J Schroeder, Attorney for DISTRICT, via email at dschroeder@neumiller.com, or via fax, or mail at the number and address set forth below.

- 2. <u>Definitions</u>. The following words or phrases shall have the following meanings:
 - A. <u>District Property</u>: all real or personal property within or outside the district, held, managed, occupied, or encumbered by the District.
 - B. <u>District Facilities</u>: all buildings and structures, appurtenances to buildings and structures, mechanical or otherwise, and roads which are owned, leased, or otherwise operated, or funded by the District.
 - C. <u>Designated Representative</u>: an individual of legal capacity designated by the District to act on behalf of District for the purposes of inspection of the Project construction and any other District interest resulting from or related to the Project.

3. Permit Terms and Conditions.

- A. District Property subject to the encroachment shall be restored to its condition as of the date of the issuance of this Permit, or better.
- B. PERMITTEE's use of District Property is limited to those purposes and those activities specifically described in this Permit. Failure of PERMITTEE to comply with this condition may result in revocation of this Permit.
- C. DISTRICT assumes no maintenance responsibility for the construction work, improvements, or other encroachments permitted on District Property pursuant to the terms of this Permit. The PERMITTEE assumes any and all maintenance responsibility for the District Property subject to the encroachment during the term of the permitted encroachment, including any construction work or improvements constructed on the District Property, so long as such encroachment is permitted on District Property.
- D. PERMITTEE shall retain at PERMITTEE's sole cost and expense a supervisor capable of providing oversight of all work subject to the Project and all problems or damage to District Property and Facilities shall be immediately reported to DISTRICT's Designated Representative. The supervisor with control over the work shall be onsite continuously during the course of the operations permitted herein.
- E. PERMITTEE shall pay the District for the cost of electricity used by PERMITTEE (INSERT TERMS FOR PAYMENT)
- F. DISTRICT's Designated Representative shall have the right to inspect the construction related to the Project performed by the PERMITTEE at any time, and, in the event DISTRICT's Designated Representative deems the District Property and/or Facilities are being jeopardized, he may order all or any portion of the work stopped, in which case PERMITTEE agrees to immediately comply with the order. Any such order to stop work shall be in writing and shall be given to the PERMITTEE's on-site representative and to its contractor, if a contractor is used. If a written order to shut down any portion of the construction is issued by the Designated Representative, then a meeting will be held on-site within twenty-four (24) hours to agree on the conditions under which construction can be restarted. If a disagreement arises between DISTRICT and PERMITTEE at such

meeting, then a third-party, designated by DISTRICT and PERMITTEE by mutual consent prior to the commencement of construction activities related to the Project will be called in within twenty-four (24) hours of the conclusion of the meeting to arbitrate the dispute, and will render a decision which shall be binding on the parties within forty-eight (48) hours after conducting the arbitration. All costs of the work by the third-party shall be born entirely by PERMITTEE.

- G. PERMITTEE shall notify DISTRICT's Designated Representative, [DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVE], via email at [DESIGNATED REPRESENTATIVE EMAIL], at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to the commencement of the operations permitted herein, and when there is no activity for a period of five (5) working days, said notice shall once again be given at least twenty-four (24) hours prior to resumption of such operations.
- H. PERMITTEE's operations permitted herein shall not interfere with access to District Property or Facilities when PERMITTEE's crews are not on site.
- I. All covenants of PERMITTEE herein shall also be deemed conditions of this Permit.
- J. The terms and conditions herein shall bind the heirs, successors and assigns, executors, administrators and transferees of PERMITTEE. PERMITTEE agrees as a condition of any transfer to obtain from the transferee its written agreement to comply with the terms of this Permit. PERMITTEE shall notify DISTRICT of the name and address of any transferee and provide to DISTRICT a copy of said transferee's agreement within ten (10) days of the transfer.
- K. If requested by DISTRICT, PERMITTEE agrees to execute any and all additional documents reasonably necessary to secure the recordation of this Permit or a memorandum thereof in the County of Tuolumne, State of California.
- L. PERMITTEE shall, within thirty (30) days of invoice, reimburse DISTRICT for its reasonable out of pocket engineering and legal costs incurred (1) in evaluating, reviewing and processing plans, designs, specifications, environmental analysis and other documents and data for the facilities, operations, construction, and repairs permitted herein; (2) preparing and reviewing this Permit; and (3) monitoring, reviewing and inspecting PERMITTEE's construction operations permitted herein.
- M. PERMITTEE shall, within thirty (30) days of completion of the improvements, supply DISTRICT with "as-built" drawings of the completed Project.
- N. Neither DISTRICT, nor any officer, agent, consultant, contractor, servant, or employee thereof is responsible for any damage or liability to the extent that such damage or liability occurs by reason of anything done or omitted to be done by PERMITTEE under or in connection with its activities under this Permit. It is understood and agreed that the PERMITTEE shall fully defend, indemnify, and save harmless DISTRICT and its officers, agents, contractors, servants, and employees from any and all claims, damages, suits, costs, expenses or actions of every name, kind and description brought for or on account of damage claim or injury as defined in Government Code section 810.8 to the

extent that such claims, suits or actions result from anything done or omitted to be done by PERMITTEE under, arising out of, or in connection with its activities under this Permit, including, without limitation, the Project. Additionally, PERMITTEE hereby waives, as to DISTRICT's Directors, engineer, attorney, consultants, employees or agents, any and all claims, damages, liability or losses arising from or related to, review, or approval of the plans, designs, specifications and other documents and data related to the Project and this Permit.

4. Permit Termination.

- A. This Permit shall be subject to termination by the Board of Directors of DISTRICT upon failure of PERMITTEE to adhere to the terms and conditions provided herein.
- B. Upon the termination of this Permit, DISTRICT's remedies against PERMITTEE set forth herein including, but not limited to, PERMITTEE's obligations (1) to fully indemnify, defend and save harmless DISTRICT; (2) to repair damage caused by its facilities or operations permitted herein, reasonable wear and tear excepted; (3) to remove its facilities permitted herein; and (4) to reimburse DISTRICT for various costs; shall survive the termination of this Permit.

5. Notice.

A. Unless changed by written notice to the parties at the addresses herein provided, the mailing address for all notices required herein shall be:

6. Repair Specifications.

- A. Repair shall be performed in compliance with July, 2015 Submittal Drawings attached and incorporated herein as Exhibit A.
- B. Additional conditions may be required to suit field conditions and will be presented to PERMITTEE for application.

7. Indemnification and Insurance.

- A. PERMITTEE agrees to fully indemnify, defend and hold harmless DISTRICT, including its governing board, trustees, officers, consultants, agents, employees and contractors, herein collectively referred to as DISTRICT Indemnitees, against any and all loss, damage, liability, claim, demand, litigation, expense, including reasonable attorney's fees, resulting from any actual or threatened injury or harm to any person or property or to the environment arising out of PERMITTEE's facilities and operations permitted herein regardless of the active or passive negligence of DISTRICT excepting only such injury or harm caused by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of DISTRICT.
- B. PERMITTEE shall secure the naming of "DISTRICT, its board of trustees and officers thereof" as additional insureds as to claims arising out of PERMITTEE's facilities and operations permitted herein on the liability policies and to the limits as required by PERMITTEE of its contractors during the period of the contractors' work permitted herein. Additionally, PERMITTEE shall at all times during the time this Permit remains in effect maintain comprehensive general liability insurance including coverage for all damages arising out of PERMITTEE's facilities and operations permitted herein with limits of a minimum of \$2,000,000.00 per occurrence to insure PERMITTEE's obligations for personal, property and environmental injury or harm as provided herein. All liability insurance shall be provided by California admitted carriers with an A- or better rating. Certificates of said insurance shall be provided to DISTRICT prior to commencement of the operations authorized herein. Said certificates shall provide for thirty (30) days prior notice to DISTRICT of termination of the insurance.
- 8. <u>PERMITTEE Duty to Repair</u>. PERMITTEE does hereby agree that at all times during and after the completion of the work that PERMITTEE shall, upon written demand by DISTRICT, perform at PERMITTEE's own cost and expense, and within the time limits set by DISTRICT to the extent those time limits are feasible, all reasonable rehabilitation, maintenance, or repair work ordered to be performed by DISTRICT which arises as a result of PERMITTEE's work, reasonable wear and tear excepted.
- 9. <u>Time is of the Essence</u>. Time is of the essence of this Permit.

10. Miscellaneous.

A. In the event any party to this Permit brings an action or arbitration to enforce any provision of this Permit, or is required to defend any action or arbitration brought by any party to this Permit the defense to which is any provision of this Permit, the prevailing party shall be entitled to reasonable attorney's fees and costs.

- B. The undersigned represent that they are authorized to enter into this permit agreement on behalf of the party for which they sign. Each party represents that it has legal authority to enter into this Permit agreement and to perform all obligations under this Permit agreement.
- 11. Entire Agreement. This Permit is intended to reflect the entire understanding between the parties, and no alteration or modification shall be valid unless made in writing and signed by the parties. The parties agree to cooperate with each other and coordinate their respective activities in a good faith effort to accomplish the objectives recited above.
