The Groveland Community Services District (GCSd) is committed to providing safe, reliable water and sewer services to our community. As part of the multi-year rate plan adopted by the GCSd Board of Directors on June 18, 2025, following the Proposition 218 process, the Fiscal Year 2026–2027 water and sewer rate increases became effective on July 1, 2026.

These annual adjustments help ensure the District can continue to operate, maintain, repair, and improve its water and sewer infrastructure while providing reliable service to our customers. Monthly Fixed Charges for Water and Sewer

Monthly fixed charges help fund the ongoing costs of operating and maintaining the District's water and sewer systems so reliable service is available every day. These costs remain whether a customer uses a little water or a lot. They include treatment chemicals, utilities, routine maintenance, equipment, regulatory compliance, staff labor, and other day-to-day operating expenses.

Water and Sewer Consumption Charges

Consumption charges cover the operational costs of water treatment and distribution and sewer collection and treatment. Charges vary based on the amount of water consumed during the billing period.

Capital Improvement Project (CIPs) Charges

These monthly charges are each customer's contribution toward major water and sewer system improvements. The collected funds pay for both the loan debt incurred for previously completed projects as well as providing funding to address future projects. Capital Improvement Projects (CIPs) are major investments in the District's water and sewer infrastructure that help ensure safe, reliable service for years to come. These projects include replacing aging water and sewer lines, rehabilitating storage tanks and pump stations, upgrading treatment facilities, improving fire hydrants, and constructing new infrastructure to meet regulatory requirements and the community's future needs.
